She was one of the initiators of the parish bulletins in the Diocese.

Her career has taken her to the Maronite Chancery where she is the Diocesan Financial Administrator. She played an important role in diocesan projects such as: the opening of the Maronite Heritage Centre – its activities and exhibitions, *Maronite 08* 'Days in the Maronite Diocese' and WYD 08, the visit of the Maronite Patriarch, coordination of the diocesan stewardship committees, chancery finance and administration, the census project, information technology and others.

In addition, she is editor-in-chief of the Eparchy's journal *Marounia*, a full-colour quarterly magazine, written in both Arabic and English, which publicizes the charism of the Maronite Church. Whether organizing articles or meetings, or disseminating information, Amal maintains warm contact with many various sections of the Maronite and Latin Catholic Churches. She unites Maronites to the nerve centre of their Church, and thus links them to each other.
